



In Memoriam

Karl Schanz, APSA, MNEC 1933-2021



It is with great sadness that we learned of Karl's passing at the age 88 on November 29, 2021 at his home inTewksbury, MA. He had been under medical treatment for a short time but his death was still unexpected.

Known throughout New England for his suburb nature images and photographic ability, Karl was a very talented master photographer, presenter, exhibitor, and judge who had shown his programs all over the United States at local camera clubs, seminars and conferences. He had been honored by both the Photographic Society of America with an Associate (APSA) and the New England Camera Club Council as a Master (MNEC) for his work in the photographic community and his photographic achievements. Karl had been a photographer for the majority of his life and though he would photograph everything and anything, he eventually evolved his photography to express his intense devotion to wildlife and nature, and he enthralled photographic audiences for many years with his outstanding images.

It was with great pride the New England Camera Club Council dedicated it's 69th Annual Conference to him in 2014 for his dedication to photography at both the local and national levels. A Showcase Theater Presenter at eight different NECCC conferences, he normally received great praise with standing ovations for his presentations.

Prior to his retirement, Karl was a machinist by trade who also knew cameras and had a small camera repair business on the side. With this experience, he was in charge of the Camera Testing Clinic at the NECCC Conference from 2004 through 2006 and for many years he was chairman of the equipment and setup committee for the Yankee Photographic Society where he was one of the original founders of the organization. If he couldn't fix it the normal way, he would invent a part, make it and repair your camera or tripod with the new part. He always found a solution to your problem. Sometimes it took him a while to do it but he always managed to fix it.

A multi-star exhibitor in PSA, Karl also competed in the Masters Class at Greater Lynn Photographic Association winning many awards throughout his competition years. At the time of his passing, he was a member of the Greater Lynn Photographic Association and a long- time member of the Massachusetts Camera Naturalists (CamNats), a by-invitation only Nature photo club dedicated to the art and teaching of natural history photography. Prior to his membership in Greater Lynn, he had been a member of the Lowell Camera Club and the Merrimac Valley Camera Club.

A well- known judge throughout New England, he judged many club, interclub and international exhibitions in both pictorial and nature, and had exhibited regionally, nationally and internationally winning numerous medals and awards. His photography evolved out of a love of nature and travel, taking him all over the United States in his camper. He also visited Alaska, Africa, Europe and made many trips to Yellowstone National Park through all seasons.

He was a valued friend to all who knew him and photographed with him. He will not only be remembered for his dedication to nature and his award-winning nature images but also for his tinkering and camera repair work. Another one of the old guard who was known by many who will be dearly missed as a photographer and friend.


















In Memoriam

NECCC Inter-club Print of the Year Competition 2019-2020

The Covid delayed NECCC Interclub Print of the Year competition for the 2019-2020 season was held on Saturday, September 11, 2021 at the Greater Lynn Photographic Association, 564 Boston Street, Lynn, Massachusetts. The shortened season (Fall and Winter competitions only), resulted in a smaller pool of prints eligible for entry into the end of the year competition, there being a total of 28 in the combined B&W Class A, B&W Class B, and Color divisions. A total of 27 prints were submitted by their makers, a turnout of 96%, the largest percentage of eligible ever prints returned. This is a remarkable figure and is probably indicative of print makers really becoming eager to see NECCC print operations return to "normal" pre-Covid activity. In the past, when the Print of the Year Competition was held at the NECCC Conference, print submissions ran as low as 15%, with an average of 30% of eligible prints being returned for entry. Judges for this competition were Jack Holmes, John Lowe, MNEC, and Sarah Musumeci, MNEC.

Jack Holmes, Past President of the Greater Lynn Photographic Association, has been a photographic world traveler for nearly 60 years. His studio-gallery "Images from Near and Far" is located at Western Avenue Studios in Lowell, Massachusetts. His work is shown in his studio as well as at other galleries in Lowell... the Arts League of Lowell, the Loading Dock Gallery and the Whistler House Museum. A presenter of digital travelogues, he also teaches basic photography and working with post-processing software such as Photoshop and Lightroom.

John Lowe, MNEC, is a member and past President of the Merrimack Valley Camera Club, a member and past Chairman of the Massachusetts Camera Naturalists (CamNats), and was a member and past Chairman of the former Yankee Photographic Society. John is a Master Member of the New England Camera Club Council, a long time member of the Photographic Society of America, and presently a member of the Southeast Volusia County Camera Club in Florida. He was the SEVC Camera Club's "Photographer of the Year" in 2014, 2019, and 2020.

Sarah Musumeci is an accomplished architectural and interior photographer, and has served as judge for local, regional, and international competitions and salons. She has presented numerous programs at many camera clubs, NECCC and Photographic Society of America (PSA) Conferences, and has been a portfolio reviewer and Videographer for the annual NECCC Conference. Sarah is a long time member and former vice-president of the Merrimack Valley Camera Club. Having been involved in photography for many years, she now specializes in architectural, travel and portrait photography. She has had numerous cover photos published and has done work for major hotels in Boston and New York City.

As with past Print of the Year competitions, class "A" and "B" monochrome were judged separately. Each division's prints were previewed completely before judging began. The smaller than usual number of entries made it convenient to hold a discussion session at the conclusion of the competition. All the prints were run through the print viewing box where attendees and judges offered opinions on composition, presentation, and print craftsmanship. Attendees were very appreciative of this post-competition discussion session, something that would be difficult to provide when working with a very large number of prints.

The Council would like to thank the Greater Lynn Photographic Association for offering their "Covid-Safe" facilities as a venue for holding this competition, as well as their "vintage" RMF scoring system. Had this location not been available, the competition might possibly have been delayed until the next conference

There were no ties for Print of the Year in any division. Second place (runner-up) awards were assigned to those prints that most likely would have won Print of the Year if the top award winner in each division had not been entered.

2021 PSA Lifetime Achievement Award Recipient

The Photographic Society of America established the Lifetime Achievement Award in 2012 as one of the Society's most prestigious awards and the Society's highest award to a member for a combination of service to photography and photographic achievement

Daniel Charbonnet III, HonPSA, EPSA, HonNEC



In October 2020, President Elena McTighe, notified Dan that the Lifetime Achievement Award Committee had unanimously elected him as the recipient of the 2021 Lifetime Achievement Award, the tenth member so recognized. He was surprised, pleased, and honored, and he was committed to receive the award in person. But it was not to be—as we all know, Dan passed away unexpectedly in December, 2020. But most importantly, he was a respected friend of photographers around the world. The Society is proud to honor Dan with the 2021 Lifetime Achievement Award. He will be missed.



COUNCIL CHALLENGE RESULTS

NECCC Places First Overall and First in Color & Nature Sections AGAIN!

Every year NECCC enters the PSA Council Challenge which is held in conjunction with PSA's Annual Foto Festival (Conference). This year the Photo Fest was live in person at Colorado Springs, CO the second week of October 2021.

The same format was used this year with three sections to send in images for: Digital Color Images, Digital Monochrome Images, and Digital Nature Images. Each council has to send 10 different entries for each section to be competitive. There were 300 images entered from ten councils into the competition. This is a decrease by three Councils and 30 images from last year. The images were scored individually in each section on a scale of 3-15 points per image with each judge scoring 1-5 points per image. Most entries were selected from past NECCC interclub submissions, along with other interclub competitions such as multiple screen and some of the nature entries came from known International Exhibition Medal winning images or the Glennie Nature Exhibition. This year I again visited some club websites and selected images displayed on those sites. You will note that there are a number of images from members of Greater Lynn – that's because Greater Lynn came in first in nature and first in color in the NECCC interclub's again this year so there were a lot of Greater Lynn images in the winners to select from. Last year NECCC came in first and I hoped to have a repeat of that this year, which we did.

As is requested each year, PSA wants a signed permission form for each image used and we continued with the process of sending forms signed with online signatures. This made it a bit easier to get the signatures but there is still the difficulty getting the email address of those makers whose images we wish to use, however all the reps from the various clubs were very helpful in getting me the correct emails or forwarding my requests to the makers. Thanks to all of them for their assistance.

My apologies to Erik Landegren- who had a beautiful winning B&W image with one color –a red rose in the image. As I was not allowed one color only B&W, I asked him to eliminate the red from the rose which he very nicely agreed to do. Unfortunately the image was not as strong without the color red in the rose and scored lower than I had hoped. I should have entered it into the Color section with the red in the rose.

I am happy to report NECCC did very very well again in the overall standings this year, placing as 1st place Council for the 3rd year in a row overall, this year by a whopping 16 points with an overall score of 355. We also finished 1st in the Color section again (2 years in a row) by 5 points and 1st in the Nature section by 14 points (Nature 1st -for the 6th year in a row), we even did a bit better in B&W this year coming in 4th place up one place from last year. Our 128 points in Nature was again the highest score overall for any section and we had six Nature award winners- 3rd place along with 5 Honor Awards and 3 of our images scoring 15 points. In Color we received a 2nd place award and three Honor Awards. I am happy to report we also had a winner in B&W with an Honor Award. The 2nd place council went to Chicago Area Camera Club Assoc. with 339 points. PSA normally gives out lovely certificates with the winning photo on them to all place winners and honor award winners. All the certificates will be mailed to the makers or presented to them at their camera clubs when I receive them.

The results along with some of our winning images will be in an upcoming PSA Journal and will give NECCC great publicity. The chairman indicated to me in several emails how excellent our images were and impressed they all were with NECCC.

The judges this year were **Joanne Stolte**, HonPSA, MPSA; **Viki Gaul**, APSA, PPSA and **Lisa Schnelzer** QPSA. All have ROPA distinction initials behind their names which means they exhibit their images in international exhibitions and are excellent photographers.

The winning images should be online soon on the PSA website- www.psa.org under competitions and our 2 placement winners 2nd & 3rd will also be published in the November issue of the PSA Journal magazine. Images can be found in 2 places:

- **A.** NECCC website www.neccc.org home page- top right side column -click the link to the NECCC entry images
- **B.** Greater Lynn website www.greaterlynnphoto.org home page -top left side column 3 links- one per section that you can click to see all 10 of the images entered in that section. We hope to have the full Video they always send each year after the competition with all 300 images on it soon. It has not been received yet, hopefully it will arrive by the end of November. When it is posted, take a moment to view these and see what NECCC is up against throughout the USA in interclub and other comps.

Next year's Deadline will be about May/June 2022. If you have an image that has done well in various competitions or exhibitions please send it to me for consideration when selecting the images for the competition. We want to send them our best and a lot of time I have no idea what has won elsewhere.






Photo Retro a new destination for film photographers opening in Photo Retro Center to provide darkrooms, gallery, studio, socializing and supplies

WHO: Photo Retro, a new destination and source for film and analog photography

WHAT: Opens for business, with demonstrations and tours of the center, chat with the founders, sign up now for darkroom time and upcoming classes, "Line Form and Texture" exhibit of black and white photos by Nashua High School South darkroom photography students

WHY: To provide a center for analog photography to serve photographers of all skill levels in southern New Hampshire, northern Massachusetts and beyond

ABOUT PHOTO RETRO:

A new hub for film photography will open on Fri., Nov. 6, 2021 in Amherst, N.H. Dubbed **Photo Retro**, it will provide two film photography darkrooms, a large format photography studio, a photo gallery and sales of film photography supplies.

The center grew from Pictoriographica, a dry plate photography business founded in 2017 by Jason Lane, of Brookline, N.H., an optical engineer designing lenses for the aerospace and defense sector. Lane and co-owner Max Affleck of New Boston, a mechanical engineer, decided to open the center because there's nothing like it in southern New Hampshire or in the region.

"We opened this center because this area needs a place dedicated to film photography," Lane said.

Despite the dominance of digital photography, Lane believes that there's plenty of room for various kinds of film photography and other alternative photographic processes.

"Film wasn't replaced by digital, it's another medium, like oil paint," he said. "This place is for someone who wants to explore shooting film, who's excited about shooting film. Film photography has seen a resurgence of interest over the past few years, and the center will cater to that growing demand.

Up front, near the darkrooms and the coffee pot, the center sells 35mm, medium format and 4x5 film supplies. The dry plate manufacturing side of the business is elsewhere at the center.

The two darkrooms have everything a film photographer needs to develop color and black and white film and print the images — three enlargers in each darkroom,

safelights, sinks, washing and drying facilities. Each darkroom has an enlarger that can be used for large format film, the others are for 35 millimeter and medium format film.

The darkrooms will be open to the public by appointment or walk-in; those who want to use them often can purchase a membership. There will be a membership discount for students.

The center's photo studio features special lights and backdrops. Customers who want a unique early-style portrait can schedule it through Photo Retro's website.

There is also space for a gallery where photographers can exhibit their work.

Lane said that he plans to offer classes in film photography and workshops. People who take the workshops will be able to use the center's film cameras. Registration is open now on the <photoretro.biz> website for both darkroom time and classes.

Local photographers who shoot film can drop it off at Photo Retro. Lane has an agreement with a local film processor, Tomorrow's Studio of Nashua, for film processing and scanning. They can process color and black and white film and scan the negatives if desired.

Photo Retro will be open Friday through Sunday from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. As the business grows the hours will expand.
