

There were 59 total entries from 8 Chapters/Councils, 31 Small Clubs and 20 Large Clubs.


Conference Dedication 2006

It is with gratitude and great pride that the New England Camera Club Council dedicated the 2006 Annual Conference to Dr. George H. Nieske, FPSA, MNEC. George was a longtime resident of Wilbraham, Massachusetts, but recently relocated to Springfield, Massachusetts, the city of his birth. The dedication is in recognition of his tireless efforts on behalf of NECCC, and for his contributions to the photographic community at both the local and national levels.

George has been an asset to the Executive Board of the NECCC for many years. Since becoming a Vice President of NECCC in 1980, George has held several positions. He was responsible for introducing the popular Hi-Jinx feature

to the NECCC Conference in 1980, and served as Director of Hi-Jinx for many years. George has been responsible for running the NECCC Print Circuit since 1983, and he currently serves as Clerk of NECCC.

In addition to his long and outstanding service to NECCC, he was a founding member of the Springfield Science Mu-



seum Camera Club. He is a Past President of the Springfield Photographic Society, for whom he also served as Chairman of the Springfield International Salon. George was also a longtime member of the Wilbraham Camera Club. A member of PSA since 1970, George served as Director of the Nature Division for twelve years.

George has received many honors and awards for his work in Nature, Color Slide, and Black and White photography. He has presented teaching programs at several NECCC Annual Conferences and PSA Conventions, as well as at Focus Outdoors, the Southwest Michigan Council of Camera Clubs and the Berks Photographic Conference in Pennsylvania. George has also lectured and judged at Camera Clubs throughout New England. He was a pioneer in the use of two screens to provide side-by-side comparisons for teaching purposes. In recognition of his service and achievement, he was elected an Associate of the Photographic Society of America (APSA) in 1979, a Master Member of the New England Camera Club Council (MNEC) in 1980, and a Fellow of the Photographic Society of America (FPSA) in 1989.

Remembering Russ Ford, MNEC

The Greater Brockton Camera Club was deeply saddened about the loss of long-time member and extraordinary photographer, Russell B. Ford.

Russ joined the Color Slide Club of Brockton (GBCC) back in 1962 with his wife, Ruth. From the very beginning the Fords were instrumental in the activities of this Club. Over the next thirty-plus years Russ would don many hats for the good of the Club. In 1968, he was our President. In 1978, Russ became only the second Editor-in-Chief of the Lens Tissue. For many of us the newsletter was our first contact with him. Each month Ruth and Russ typed out the newsletter complete with informative articles, helpful hints, and amusing anecdotes. During Russ' tenure as Editor, the Lens Tissue gained national attention earning an honorable mention and an award for creativity.

Russ was a very active participant in our monthly competitions. He was doing things in his darkroom that are now only accomplished with the aid of PhotoShop and other digital darkroom programs. Back in 2002, the GBCC Board of Directors voted to add another trophy to our end-of-the-year awards. For the member who compiles the most points in the print competitions, GBCC would acknowledge him/her with the Russell B. Ford Trophy. Russ was the consummate competitor as evidenced by his numerous Club ribbons and trophies.

I wonder what his reaction to the digital revolution would have been, hmmm... 👼



For the judging a special site will be setup along with a distinct password for each of the judges so that they may then review each newsletter within their assigned groupings. It is hoped that this will inspire more clubs to enter the competition as the number of clubs currently competing have dropped over the past several years due to the dominance of those clubs who produced printed color issues. Clubs that print in black and white versions, due to the expense of color printing, felt left out. If your club's newsletter editor needs help in converting the document to an Acrobat PDF file I will be very happen to help them out in this endeavor.

Our congratulations are extended to Dan Charbonnet who received the high honor of Fellow, Photographic Society of America (FPSA) at the annual Awards Banquet. It is a most

Photo Talk Radio Session

Tips for better results with digital photography...

This is from **The Housatonic Camera Club Newsletter** - John Frenzel, Editor

- 1. If you are using a digital point and shoot or fixed lens prosumer model camera, turn off the "digital zoom" It is really junk (just loses you resolution) and you can achieve much better results in the photo editing software you use.
- 2. To maintain the quality of your images never work on the original files. Always work from a copy. When at all possible, batch convert files to TIFF files. They are larger in size, but do not lose quality with repeated saving. Every time a JPEG file is saved it undergoes some compression and over time this can seriously impact the quality of your photo.
- For smudges on the lens, don't use a tissue to remove it, this
 merely smudges it more, look into a product such as The
 Lens Pen. Designed specifically for cleaning optical lenses,
 this product can be purchased from B & H or Adorama for
 about \$10.00.
- 4. This is a biggie, memory cards can and will malfunction. It is wise not to put all your digital eggs into one memory card basket, so to speak. I use several 512 cards when I am shooting a great deal. This way, if there is a problem, I've not lost all of the pictures I have taken.
- 5. Many digital cameras on the market today have a bracketing feature to aid in getting a proper exposure. If your camera does not offer exposure bracketing, but lets you shoot in camera raw, then this can still be easily accomplished. Just open your file, set exposure, then open the file again, set a different exposure. Now you have 2 copies of an identical photo that can easily be worked on in the photo editing software of your liking.

What serious photographer has not looked at what are now famous depression-era photographs and thought "what great work," "I could have made images like that if only all the obviously interesting subjects were still around." As a child I would study a book that my grandfather kept in his den with wondrous black and white images of sidewheeler steam ships, some of which had come to grief on the New England coast.

We cannot step back in time, but we can learn to see the fading remnants of yesterday and photograph them before they are gone. On the chance some of your images survive, perhaps they will fascinate some in an unborn generation, as the images from the 1800's fascinate us today.

Take on a self assignment to photograph yesterday. Make a collection of images, photographing things destined to be swallowed by the hungry beast that is time. Think about it: Old New England farms from a simpler time that now stand as old gray ghosts with dry rot barns and rusting roofs. The quaint harbor, paradise in morning light awaits an exposure of f/11, as fish stocks slowly run out and all is enveloped in the fog of time.

You cannot photograph the past, but the still image is time frozen for examination. The world is fascinating, the view-finder a magical looking glass. When the elements and your artistic vision converge, seize the moment for soon enough unseen demons will steal your inspiration and muddy the light.

Obituary

Elizabeth R. Cunningham, PhD, APSA, MNEC, of New Britain, CT at the age of 91 died September 3, 2006, having been a member of PSA since 1976.

She retired as an Associate Professor in Central Connecticut University's Department of Elementary Education. She, and a friend, produced many AV shows which were divided evenly between travel and instructional themes. These were shown widely at many area camera clubs and at various regional gatherings. She also was a very qualified and popular judge for both color slides and prints and, as such, rendered extensive service to the area clubs.

Betty was a well known accomplished and prolific creator of both color slides and large prints working with both pictorial and nature subjects. She also was a very skilled artist and an active member of the New Britain, CT Art League and frequently had photos and paintings displaying the same subject matter. One of her specialties was depicting butterflies, and on this subject she excelled.

She was also deeply involved in serving the refreshments at club meetings and, as well, for a long time was a score keeper for club competitions.

For many years Betty served for the entire weekend on the Hospitality Table for the New England Camera Club Council's annual conference.

She was an active member of both New Britain Camera Club and the Charter Oak Photo Society, and the Star Group.

Betty was awarded her APSA in 1987 at the Long Beach, California PSA Conference for her outstanding achievements in the many facets of photography. Glennie Goes Digital

The Merrimack Valley Camera Club (MVCC) will host and conduct the next annual George W. Glennie Nature Salon on Wednesday, March 28, 2007 at the Trinitarian Congregational Church, Elm Street, North Andover, MA. This salon/exhibition is open to all member organizations of NECCC.

MVCC President and Chairman of the 2007 salon, Charlie Burke, announced that the competition will held, for the first time, using only digital images. He expressed the thought that the change to the digital format would provide more organizations with the opportunity to participate in this showcase event of nature photography.

Each participating organization may submit 10 images, with no more than 2 by each maker. In the inadvertent event that images are submitted by 2 or more clubs by the same maker, the earliest entries will qualify for individual and club awards. The other entries will be judged but are ineligible for

any awards, club or individual. Also ineligible are all slides that have received awards in previous Glennie salons.

There will be Club Awards for those receiving the 3 highest scores. The individual awards will include Best of Show, Best Animal, Best Bird, Best Botany, Best General Subject, Best Insect or Arachnid, and Best Landscape. Merit and Honor Awards will also be presented.

Each digital image may have a maximum width of 1024 pixels and a maximum height of 768 pixels. The image must be submitted in JPEG (jpg) format and the size is limited to no more than 500 KB.

Images may be submitted either by using Internet email or on a CD. Online registration is also being investigated. Further information concerning entry fees, entry forms and mailing addresses will be provided at a later date.

The following is a statement of the basic guideline concerning Nature digital images: No elements may be moved, cloned, added, deleted, rearranged, combined or changed in any way that affects the integrity of the image content. No manipulation or modification is permitted except resizing, cropping, selective lighting or darkening, restoration of the original color of the scene. No special effects filters can be added or applied, and any sharpening must appear natural.

Seeing at the Beach

On a beach somewhere on the coast of Rhode Island... crowded on a hot July day... the sun warms us, but not the water. The sand is bright and soft, sloping quickly to the ocean's edge. The surf is up and loud, making white frothy patterns in the turquoise water. Colors and sounds are everywhere. Brightly suited children play with a delightful energy, as constant as the surf. Above it all is a soft blue cloudless sky.

Taking in all this sensory information, it seems that photography, or any visual art, has some basic limitations. Here at the beach, the light and colors are striking, but the un-seeables take over the sensory lead after time makes the visions familiar. The cool, intermittent breeze becomes the dominant sensation. Next are sounds... people, especially children and their yelps of joy... and the roaring, persistent tumble of the waves, the base of this beach.

By creating an image, we hope to convey a sense of place, a feeling in the viewer of being there. Perhaps this all important feeling is produced as much or more by the un-seeables as by the graphics in the image. Perhaps the image is but a vessel to transport "being there" at the beach by recalling memories of cool breezes, children's joy, and crashing waves. Perhaps a photographic image communicates by making unseen associations in the mind, not the eyes, of the viewer. The image, "seen" in this light, becomes a great gift.

A graphic image has the potential to be powerful and moving, even if the ultimate understanding is found in the mind of the viewer. The photographer must not only compose and expose an image. He must first feel something, want to communicate it, and have the skills to do just that, visually. The skills can be taught and learned.

Looking at a scene can evoke strong, unique feelings. We call this inspiration, as universal a human experience as creativity. Inspiration is a natural phenomenon; a gasp, a widening of the eyelids, a connection with something greater than ourselves. It may arise instantly, or it may take time to peel away the layers of our lives to find it.

By looking and seeing we give ourselves time to be inspired. These are basic visual skills, the foundation of our art. They are not inherited traits, but are skills we get better at the more we practice them. A photographer never stops looking. We ask ourselves questions. "What brought me here? What attracts me to this place? Is there something else here I didn't expect to see?"

It does take time to see, at the beach or anywhere. Give yourself the gift of time. Annie Dillard wrote in her book, "Pilgrim at Tinker Creek", "Spend the day, you can't take it with you".



Camera Care

Tall of the year is usually a time of beauty throughout our country, but it also might turn into a time of aggravation for either film or digital camera owners who have used their camera heavily during a vacation or photo trip. This cause for irritation could show up in a film model as a locked iris control on the lens barrel due to several drops of some sugary liquid that has dried. On a digital camera a tiny control button might be missing causing an important switch to be inoperable. Whale watching on a boat, with a big splash from "Moby Dick" landing on your camera usually means a lock-up of some moving part after the water dries! Even careful wiping with a cloth may not remove all the salt residue.

There is a lot of good to be said for "smallness" nowadays! But too small may be a problem! Be careful where, on your clothing, you put that tiny, slim, digital model. One customer forgot his was in a back pocket, sat down and cracked open the LCD display! A costly mistake! It required nearly one hundred fifty dollars to replace!

Is there an older, discarded film camera in your life? Some parents are having them restored for a child to use, hoping he/she will learn photographic basics first, then go to digital for electronic manipulation.

The after effects of Hurricane Katrina will be with us for some time to come. We receive e-mails asking for restoration possibilities of a camera soaked in water for days in New Orleans. Sadly, it cannot be done for any reasonable cost. Corrosion begins within minutes of immersion, and sewage water intensifies the damage!

The Tamron lens test for this issue was somewhat disappointing due to the more than usual decentering of lens elements. Perhaps another lens of same type would show better results.
