Speaking of service...there are many of you who go above and beyond for your clubs. You volunteer for many of the menial tasks and many of the






New England Camera Club Council 2018 Conference Honorees

I am still astounded by the variety of activities participants could choose from. I went to many Photo-Ops -my personal favorite- to get hands on experience with people available to help you at any time. In addition to attending Photo-Ops, I took several classes including: Lightroom Mobile for Iphone/Tablet, Making Better Nature Photographs, and Techniques for Photographing Water. The classes were very interesting and have given me a different way to look at taking photos.

The class led by Betty Wiley (*Lightroom Mobile for Iphone/Tablet*) was interesting as I learned about the diverse functions within the in-app camera. As Lightroom Mobile is an app I use to edit my photographs constantly, it was very beneficial to learn new information. Within the session titled *Making Better Nature Photographs* by Hector Astorga, I was very inspired by Hector's work. His photography was absolutely stunning and because I love to photograph wildlife, Hector's work stood out to me in a meaningful way. His stories of capturing each photo made me excited to take more photos.

Finally the class *Techniques for Photographing Water* led by Mandy Lea taught me to be patient when working in the field and to look at several angles to find the best shot. Mandy's advice allowed for me to look at a new way of taking photos- leading me to take the photo that I have decided to submit. The photo reflects what I learned during this conference- you can always Breen 2 make a simple object appealing using the right angles, maintaining patience, and listening to advice from more experienced photographers.

During the 73rd annual photography conference I learned a lot. I learned how to use lightroom cc and Photoshop. I also learned how to mask photos using those two sources. I went too Mark Bowie's lecture and that is how I learned about photoshop and lightroom cc. If I didn't go to this conference then I wouldn't have gotten the amazing experience and the help I got and would have had to learn it later on in my photography career.

The first thing i learned at the NECCC conference is masking. Masking has taught me a lot not specifically about changing your picture to make it not only look different but changing your picture to making it look the way your eyes saw it. A lot of people who aren't aware of this think Photoshop is a scary thing because yes some people overuse it. When I tell people I learned how to Photoshop they are automatically against it because of how some people use it. I have to end up telling them that I dont over use it because i was taught the right way to use Photoshop.

Masking is a very important product when it comes to Photoshop because it can like I said earlier help the person looking at your picture see exactly how you saw it. Masking is basically when u put one picture on top of the same picture both with different exposure and blend them together. I think it is very interesting that nobody can see what you see so you try your hardest to show others how you saw it even though nobody will ever know how you saw it. Nora Judkins New England Shutterbugs Sponsor A Snapshot of My First NECCC Experience



As a first-time attendee of the conference, I was totally unaware of what to expect when I arrived. I was hoping to learn more about nature photography as well as learn new techniques of Lightroom and Photoshop. The variety of classes offered allowed me to achieve these goals, as well as explore new topics.

One of my favorite classes was called "Multiple Exposures For Maximum Landscapes" by Mark Bowle. I was reintroduced to the technique of blending multiple photos by using Lightroom, which is a concept which I have heard of in the past, yet had not delved into it. The presenter showed us how to use histograms to help create the ideal photo. I was eager to incorporate the blending technique as soon as I got home.

I also learned about perspective in "The Importance of Perspective" by Cusl Taylor, specifically the technique of forced perspective. As I continue to photograph in the future, I will always keep in mind what I heard several times at the conference: "shoot what it *feels* like." Lighting is the easiest way to change the mood of a photo, but other techniques such as forced perspective cause the same setting to relay a different message.

By the end of the conference weekend I left with several pages of notes and a new level of knowledge having to do with multiple aspects of photography. I am overwhelmingly grateful to have had this special opportunity. Attached is a panoramic I took of the sunset, which consists of five stitched photographs. I created this panoramic using the new Lightroom technique that I learned about during the conference.

July 12-15 2018 Marked the 73rd Convening of the Neccc Photo Conference at Amherst, Ma. There had been some a priori concerns that this year's program would not on par with previous sessions. First, therewas a change in the coordinating chair personal with Lisa and Tom Cuchara assuming the mantel of responsibility. Second, there was an intentional decision to invite more first-timepresenters instead of relying on the tried and true presenters from past conferences. [Note from conference chairs, the speakers were "new" in that they had never presented at NECCC before, most of the speakers were well experienced speakers and photographers, they were just new to NECCC. In hindsight we should have made sure that this distinction was clear to prospective attendees]

Post hoc, the general consensus was that this was among the best conferences people could recall. Lisa and Tom did a yeoman's job orchestrating all the working parts and werevisible and were 'hands on' all weekend long. Great job! The first-time presenters measured up to the task and complemented the veteran speakers. Novel, interesting and engaging programs were available to be attended during each of the 13 session segments over the entire weekend. No dead spots. The singular downside to that fact was that there wasn't enough time to partake in all of the activities that I would have liked to. I guess this is just another reason to plan to return next year. Throughout the weekend groups of photographers could be seen about campus photographing cosplay and other captivating characters or raptors, getting expert instruction on the use of ND filters, smart phones or shooting the traditional NECCC models.

The above special activities were in addition to this year's augmented Photo Ops sessions. Some of the highlights from this activity included opportunities to photograph still lifesetups, cuddly creatures, snowflakes, water droplets, various tabletop setups and flowers frozen in ice. There was an incredible array of creative ideas many of which you could replicate at home. The NECCC Photo Ops staff is inventive, they have an eye for detail, are friendly and helpful so the rotations run smoothly and everyone has fun getting a few good shots.

I counted 40 plus speakers some of who presented more thanone program. Initially, I was going to note the "best" programs but was impressed by virtually every speaker. Discussing my assessments with other WPS members and attendees in general there was considerable agreement. Those who attended programs different from the ones I did provided positive feedback about those activities too. FYI for those who did not attend, there were talks on various aspects of General Photography, Nature, Portraiture, Photojournalism, Travel Photography, instructions for using your SmartPhone as a camera, and talks on various aspects of post-processing techniques. Those were just the biggies. Darrel Gulin, the keynote speaker, gave an inspirational show entitled "Vision: Capturing Moments On All 7 Continents." His stunning images stimulated the wanderlust in every soul in the audience.

In addition to all of these engaging activities there was the drawing of the **over \$18 thousand dollars** of door prizes. Lots of cool stuff photographers would want and who doesn't like winning something. WPS members had the good fortune of being the recipients of quite a few door prizes. Another aspect of the NECCC experience is the image competitions. The Digital segment has two categories "Open"and "Nature." Similarly, there are two categories, "Color" and "B&W" for the Print competition. Attendees can submit oneimage per category.

For all of you who attended I hope that you had as enjoyable a time as I did. I had an opportunity to photograph some cool things, learned more about photographic techniques as well as about post-processing approaches and of course purchased a few "absolutely necessary" items. Gary of Hunt's offered attendees super deals on bags, tripods, cameras, printers and the list just goes on. Major named vendors were promoting their equipment by allowing us to take out cameras and\or lenses on loan. There were also quite a few companies promoting their various tours. It was like being in a photographic candy store.

In sum, this past NECCC weekend was a hit. The new leadership did a wonderful job organizing, choosing the speakers and the NECCC staff did a superlative job, as usual. It's truly one of the best learning and experiential opportunities and for tuition price one of the best bargains around. I hope that those who attended will plan to return next year. For those of you who have yet to be initiated, I strongly encourage to mark July 12 – 15, 2019 on your calendar today and commit yourself to attend NECCC next year. I will look forward to seeing your there.

Conference Registrations will begin earlier

- 1. All applications will now be subject to a \$40 co-pay at the time of the appplication
- 2. There is a new NECCC VP in charge of this function-Fran MacDonald, MNEC

We invite each NECCC member club to select one of their club members to receive a courtesy co-pay registration to the next NECCC conference, held at U-Mass, Amherst, Mass. on July 12-14, 2019. The registration gives the member submitted by your club all the learning experiences, photo opportunities and inspirational programs that go along with the conference. Please note: the enrollment co-pay covers <u>only</u> the registration fee. The recipient will be responsible for their own room & meals.

Rules governing the courtesy co-pay enrollment:

- 1. Candidates must be at least eighteen years of age as of July 1, 2019
- 2. Candidates must be a member of an NECCC member club whos dues are paid for the current year
- 3. Candidates must have never attended a previous NECCC conference
- 4. Selection of the candidate will be the responsibility of the individual clubs
- 5. Applications must be made by email from the club President or NECCC Representative
- Enrollment will open on December 1, 2018 and should be completed by January 15, 2019 Applications will not be accepted after the original deadline (March 1, 2019)).
- 7. The application cannot be transferred. Once someone has been submitted, accepted & has received the key paper work, that person must register for the conference. If he/she cannot attend, another person cannot take his/her place. The club's courtesy co-pay enrollment for that year will be forfeited.
- 8. The \$40 co-pay may be made by the member club or the enrollment recipient. All co-pay checks should be made out to NECCC and sent to the Director's postal address listed below, within 10 days of emailing in the candidates name. Please put the club name on the check. An email will be sent to the club contact listed in the email application ackowledging reciept of the co-pay check.

I called this image "The King." The lion was at the Southwick Zoo in Mendon, MA. My original vision was to enlarge his mane and then let it "morph" into a different image. To me, that was going to be a lot of work. So, instead, I decided to digitally "paint" this image. I first added in grasses from one of my background files. (I take backgrounds, textures, skies, etc. and save them for future images). Then, using no plug-ins (no Topaz, no NIK, etc.), I used the mixer brush and other Photoshop brushes to digitally paint every aspect of this image. Look into the numerous You Tube videos (or other Photoshop tutorials) on the use and application of the Mixer Brush in Photoshop. I hope you enjoy this image.



2018 Annual Conference Print Competition

Arthur S. Vaughan, HonNEC, Chairman, NECCC Print Competition

The annual B&W and Color print competition was held at the 73rd annual NECCC Conference in Amherst on Saturday, July 14, 2018. A total of 96 Color and 76 Black & White prints were entered. The number of prints submitted was down a bit from last year's conference totals of 103 Color and 82 B&W. The judging and medal winner selection process took just under three hours to complete. Judges for this competition were Daniel Charbonnet (HonPSA, EPSA, MNEC), Jacob Mosser (HonPSA, HonNEC, EPSA), and Sarah Musumeci (MNEC).

Daniel Charbonnet has been seriously involved in photography since 1973. He's very active in the Photographic Society of America and NECCC and is our current NECCC President. He is the recipient of the highest award given by the PSA, the President's Award, and in 2016 the NECCC honored Dan by dedicating the 71st conference to him. He is presently the chairman of PSA's Exhibition Standards Committee and serves as an Ethics Review Advisor. Dan is a member of the Greater Lynn Photographic Association, a member and past chairman of the Massachusetts Camera Naturalists (CamNats), as well as past chairman of the PSA Nature Division and the former PSA Exhibitions Services Vice-President. He holds multiple Star and Galaxie ratings in Color Projected Image, Nature, Photo Travel, and Photojournalism. He's also a club, interclub, and International Exhibitions judge, lecturer, and author on all aspects of photography.

Jacob Mosser has earned top honors from the PSA, NECCC, and the Greater Lynn Photographic Association for both his photographic skills and his efforts on behalf of the photographic community. He has been a recipient of the PSA "Stuyvesant Peabody Award" for his significant contributions to pictorial photography and along with his wife Susan, has had a past NECCC Conference dedicated to him. Jake is a member and past Chair of the Massachusetts Camera Naturalists (CamNats), past Chair of PSA's Nature Division, and PSA's Ethics Review Committee, past President and Honorary Life Vice president of GLPA, and is a past President and a current Vice President of NECCC. A multi Galaxie and Diamond Star competitor in International Exhibitions, he has served as a judge and lecturer throughout the USA and Canada, and has had his work published in numerous magazines and calendars.

Sarah Musumeci is a long time member and former vice-president of the Merrimack Valley Camera Club. Having been involved with photography for many years, she now specializes in architectural, travel, and portrait photography. She began taking interior photographs for small Bed & Breakfast businesses around New England but soon advanced to major hotels in Boston and New York City. She has had nearly two dozen magazine cover photos published and has much experience in the editorial world. She has given presentations at many regional camera clubs, the NECCC and PSA Conferences, and has been a Portfolio Reviewer at the NECCC Conference for many years. As a highly talented and much sought after judge, she has served in that role at the local camera club level, at over twenty PSA and NECCC Interclub Competitions, and several International Exhibitions in both projected images and prints. She has also served as the NECCC conference videographer for several years producing material for the council website, Facebook, and YouTube.

Judging to establish which entries went into the "final fifteen group" for medal consideration went fairly quickly, taking about an hour each for both the B&W and Color divisions. An additional hour was spent in selecting the Honor Award and medal winning prints in both categories, with the competition concluding at about 3:45 PM. Determining which of each division's "final fifteen" prints received medals involved more than the usual amount of "lively discussion", close inspection, direct comparison, and weighing of "pros and cons". This was a lengthy process which kept some print makers on the edge of their seats. Picking the top awards could have moved along a bit faster if "split decisions" were accepted for determining the medal winners. Ultimately, the judges were all in agreement regarding the assigning of awards. Our judge's enthusiasm, effort, and willingness to take the time to participate in the 73rd conference print competition is greatly appreciated.

The work performed by all the members of the 2018 conference print competition committee is also greatly appreciated. Sharing print room and competition duties this year were Richard Cox, Glenn and Jane Guaraldi, MNEC's, Susan Hall, Gary and Judi Hoyt, MNEC's, John Lowe, MNEC, Dave Powell, and Valerie Whittier. Without their willingness to step up and share the work involved in running the conference print competition the council would find it impossible to continue to provide the print competition and its associated exhibition as the popular activity that it is.

The members of the equipment committee did their usual outstanding work in preparing the Cape Cod Room for use as an exhibition hall and venue for the competition. This was our fifth year at this great location, and their quick response to any print room request is greatly appreciated.

Very much appreciated also are all the folks who took the time to visit the print room and browse through the prints on display, both before, during, and after the competition. This includes the Saturday night post-fine arts center program "crush", where an almost unbelievable amount of people swarm into the room to view the results of the day's competition. The Cape Cod Room is an ideal location with plenty of room and great lighting... very well suited for viewing prints. Visitors enjoy viewing the complete lot of entries displayed together, making it easy to compare photographic, printing, and mounting techniques. A significant amount of discussion takes place and much information is exchanged at this time.

Finally, thanks must go to all the attendees who took the time to prepare prints for the competition. Despite being down a few prints in each division, the judges had more than enough material to "chew on". Having the print room filled with great photographs and knowing that the judges are going to have a tough time selecting the medal winners never gets "old".



COUNCIL CHALLENGE RESULTS

Every year NECCC enters the PSA Council Challenge which is held in conjunction with PSA's Annual Conference. There were three sections in this year's challenge: Digital Color Images, Digital Monochrome Images, and Digital Nature Images. Each council is allowed to send 10 different entries for each section. There were 330 images entered from eleven councils into the competition. This is an increase of 60 images or two more councils. This year they scored on a lower scale of 3-15 points per image. Most entries were selected from past NECCC interclub submissions and some of the nature entries came from known International Exhibition Medal winning images. This year PSA requested a sign permission form for each image used which made it a bit more difficult to use the winning interclub images as we had limited info on how to reach the makers of the images.

NECCC came in 3rd place overall with 351 points which was much better than our 6th place finish last year. We again placed first in points in Nature (for the 3rd year in a row) with a score of 129 points. This was the highest points overall for any section and had five Nature award winners- 2nd place and 4 Honor Awards. In Mono we scored 112 points and again won 2nd place with two Honor Awards. In Color we scored 110 points and received three Honor Awards. The first place overall winner was Chicago Area Camera Clubs (CACCA) with 364 points (the 2nd year in a row) and 2nd place went to S4C of California with 363 points. PSA gave out lovely certificates with the winning photo on them to all place winners and honor award winners. All the certificates were mailed to the makers or presented to them at their camera clubs.

The winning images were on display at the Salt Lake City 80th Annual Conference in the print room, and there is also a slide show of the winning images on the PSA website at https://psa-photo.org/index.php?councils-challenge-2018-video


