
can you help your club? Do you have ideas to share with the NECCC board? Your input is needed and is valuable. Let me know how NECCC can support your club!

Please remember, not every person submitted will automatically receive an honor. The applicants' proposals will be evaluated by a three-person honors committee, and ratified by a quorum vote of the council. The Honors will be given out to the most deserving candidates, based on the applicants' contributions to the New England photographic community.

NEW ENGLAND CAMERA CLUB COUNCIL, INCORPORATED

HONORS

Honorary Member, New England Camera Club Council --- HonNEC

Awarded for superior leadership in the operation of our Council, such as a minimum of two years as president or five years in any other office or combination of offices and/or superior photographic leadership in the New England area. For achieving substantial and outstanding recognition in the field of photography through activities for a minimum of ten years through lecturing, judging, writing and administrative activities in the New England area. This honor is limited to a maximum of two each year.

Master Member, New England Camera Club Council --- MNEC

Awarded to those who have (1) performed exceptional service to the Council for several years, and (2) have substantially advanced photography in the New England area through lecturing, teaching, judging and through other administrative activities in photographic organizations in their community. This honor is limited to a maximum of five each year.

Associate Member, New England Camera Club Council --- ANEC

Awarded to those outside of the New England area who have made significant contribution to the promotion of photography in the New England area through extensive appearances on the program of the NECCC annual conference or 20 lectures to New England camera clubs.

SPECIAL RECOGNITION - AWARDED BY EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Honorary Vice-President New England Camera Club Council

This honorary officership is not intended as a lettered honor, but is awarded at the discretion of the Executive Committee for superior and sustained contribution to the organizational efforts and activities of the Council's annual conference. This award is intended for those outside of New England or those in the New England area who are not photographers, but who have contributed tremendously to the success of our annual conference.

INSTRUCTIONS TO THE PROPOSER

The NECCC Honors are awarded in recognition of contribution to the advancement of the art and science of photography in the New England area. Quality of character, administrative activities, service through lecturing, teaching, judging and writing are as important as an outstanding competition record. Before proposing a candidate, weigh carefully the responsibility you are assuming and your duty to the New England Camera Club Council. These considerations should transcend any desire you may have to do a favor for someone. Do not submit an application unless you are fully convinced that the candidate's qualifications are far above average. Try to give the committee a verbal picture of the candidate as an individual as well as a photographer. Present all facts in a brief and concise manner, avoiding exaggeration. List the candidate's qualifications under each of these general headings:

- 1. Administrative activities
- 2. (A) Lecturing, (B) Judging, (C) Teaching, (D) Writing
- 3. (A) Photographic Achievements, (B) Exhibition Record, (C) Competition Awards
- 4. Other qualifications
- 5. Summarize the candidate's most outstanding qualifications in a short cover letter which accompanies the application.



YOU ARE INVITED TO ENTER – The Photographic Society of Rhode Island (PSRI) invites all photographers everywhere to submit slides or digital images to the **OCEAN STATE INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITION** – **Dual Projection.** All phases of the exhibition will be conducted in accordance with the recommended practices of the Photographic Society of America and PID - Open/General Color.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – You may enter either slides or digital images, but not both. There is no restriction on subject. The exhibition is open to anyone; however, an entry may be rejected when the sponsoring organization or its agent, in its reasonable discretion, believes the entry does not conform to exhibition rules and conditions or deemed inappropriate or offensive. This exhibition is recognized and acceptances are eligible for PSA Star Ratings in the PID - Projected Image Division. Both color & monochrome images can be entered.

Report cards will be sent to each entrant within 14 days after the judging. **Our acceptance rate is normally 30-35%.** No printed catalogs will be available. An electronic color PDF version of the catalog will be emailed to all entrants that supply a valid e-mail address. A "print ready" digital catalog can be provided upon request.

Entries must originate as photographs (image/captures of objects via light sensitivity) made by the entrant on photographic emulsion or acquired digitally. By virtue of submitting an entry, the entrant certifies the work as his own and permits the sponsors to reproduce all or part of the entered material free of charge for publication and/or display in media related to the exhibition. This may include low resolution posting on a website. The exhibition assumes no liability for any misuse of copyright. Images may be altered, either electronically or otherwise, by the maker and artwork or computer graphics created by the entrant may be incorporated if the photographic content predominates. All final work must be on photographic film or digital file.

Each image must have a unique title. Once an image has been accepted in the Ocean State International, that same image, or a like "in camera" or a reproduction duplicate of that image or re-titled may not be reentered in this exhibition regardless of its title.

SLIDE ENTRIES: Entry fee (US Dollars) can be paid in cash, check (payable to Michael DiStefano) or PayPal (see below). A total of four (4) slides, exposed by the entrant, may be submitted in 2" x 2" mounts only. Ready mounts (cardboard, plastic or glass) are acceptable. Slides must be clearly marked with the title, maker's name and address, projection sequence number (1, 2, 3, 4), and must be spotted in the lower left hand corner as viewed normally. Mail Entry: Are for slides only. There is no option for digital mail entry. All digital entries must be submitted via the web inter-net.

DIGITAL ENTRIES: Digital images will be projected with a CANON REALIS SX80 at native resolution 1400x1050. Go to http://psri.us and click on the OCEAN STATE EXHIBITION link in upper right corner. 

Honorary Member (HonPSA) of the Photographic Society of America (PSA) was officially conferred at the Saturday night Honors Banquet to three Massachusetts club members; Dan Charbonnet, HonPSA, EPSA, MNEC of Westwood, MA, a member of Greater Lynn PA and Stony Brook CC and Jacob Mosser, HonPSA, EPSA, HonNEC, and Susan Mosser, HonPSA, HonNEC of North Reading, MA, members of Greater Lynn PA. This is the second highest award that PSA bestows. Since 1940, out of the over 6000 members of PSA, this award

has been given only 117 times and only thirty-seven of the Honorees are still living. There are only five recipients on the east coast and four of them live in New England. All four belong to Greater Lynn PA and two John Fuller and Dan Charbonnett have duel memberships with Stony Brook CC and Greater Lynn.

John Fuller, HonPSA, HonNEC received his Honorary last year at the New Mexico Conference. The award must be a unanimous vote by the Honors Committee and then a unanimous vote of approval by the PSA Board of Directors. It is awarded for contributions to the advancement of photography that are primarily service oriented. There were eleven Honorary Members elected this year from all over the world. The citations are too long to list here but Dan's was given for his work on the PSA BOD and as VP of Exhibitions; Susan's for her work as past program director of PSA's conferences, among other services; and Jake's for his work as PSA Ethics Committee Chair also among other services both local and council. All three are members of the NECCC BOD and Susan is the Conference Co-Chair for 2016 and a life vice president of the BOD.

# Photographic Society of America's Conference Competition Results Susan Mosser, HonPSA, HonNEC NECCC Board of Director Vice President

#### **COUNCIL CHALLENGE**

Every year NECCC enters the PSA Council Challenge which is held in conjunction with PSA's Annual Conference. This year's Council's Challenge was again hosted and judged by the Hilo Photo Club in Hawaii. There were three sections: Digital Color Images, Digital Monochrome Images, and Digital Nature Images. Each council is allowed to send 10 different entries for each section. There were over 300 entries from eleven councils entered into the competition. The color entries were handled by Bill Barnett, MPSA, AFIAP, MNEC and the Monochrome and Nature entries were handled by Susan Mosser, HonPSA, HonNEC. Most entries were selected from past NECCC interclub submissions and some of the nature entries came from International Exhibition Medal winning images. There were 330 images entered from eleven councils.

NECCC came in fourth place with 324 points, only one point out of third which was 325 points. We have finished first or second for the past few years so this was a bit disappointing, however we did place first in points in nature and one of our images won Best in Show overall. The first place overall winner was Chicago Area Camera Clubs (CACCA) with 341 points (they also were first last year). PSA gave out lovely certificates with the winning photo on them to all place winners and honor award winners which have been mailed out to the winning makers.

# What is PSA? - (Maybe You'd Like to Join!) By Marilyn and Rick Cloran, FPSA's, MPSA's, MNEC's

PSA is the national organization that provides a framework and structure to amateur photography. The Society has individual, club, and council or chapter level memberships. The New England Camera Club Council (NECCC) is a member council. More importantly, many of our fellow New Englander's are individual members of PSA in addition to being members of a club.

PSA membership brings a number of benefits including the PSA Journal. The Journal has a variety of articles each month including how to's, travel info, digital tips, recognition of photographic achievement, and much more. Newer members often find the Study Groups available in many different areas including: pictorial images (representing the combination of the old Color Projected Image and Electronic Image Divisions), nature images, portraiture, and prints, to be very beneficial in expanding their skills and learning how to evaluate their own and other peoples work. A growing number of these study groups are available on-line. They also have special opportunities, such as portrait competitions for individuals or creative competitions for individuals that are available to PSA members for no charge this year.

There is a special section of the PSA web site dedicated to member photography education. The majority of these courses are free to PSA members. They cover everything from basic composition and photographic techniques to a full course with certification on image evaluation (judging). On the PSA home page click on the Education tab or use this link <a href="http://www.psa-photo.org/index.php?sn-education">http://www.psa-photo.org/index.php?sn-education</a>. The section is intended to help members improve their photographic skills from capture to image evaluation to get the most out of their membership. As we noted above, most of these resources on the page are free to PSA members, so have a look.

PSA also serves as a governing body providing structure to the international exhibitions that are held within the US and around the world. The Greater Lynn International was and the Ocean State International is still recognized by PSA for its adherence to these rules and for its efficient management. You may hear your program chairman talking about "star ratings" when they introduce a judge or presenter. These ratings are very similar to bridge or chess masters points and represent the cumulative level of acceptances that the person has gathered in PSA recognized international exhibitions. These ratings are only available to PSA members.

Finally, you may hear or see presenters introduced as APSA, FPSA, HonPSA, HonFPSA, PPSA, EPSA, MPSA or GMPSA. The APSA (Associate of the Photographic Society of America), FPSA (Fellow of the Photographic Society of America), HonPSA (Honorary Member of PSA), and HonFPSA (Honorary

Fellow of PSA) **honors** are conferred on individual members for their work on behalf of the Society, local and regional photographic organizations and their contributions to furthering the understanding and appreciation of photography. We are talking years and in some cases decades of work here. Several New Englanders carry these honors.

The PPSA (Proficiency in Photography), EPSA (Excellence in Photography), MPSA (Master of Photography), and GMPSA (Grand Master of Photography) distinctions are conferred based on the individual's accumulated record in international exhibitions in multiple areas, e.g., Pictorial, Nature, Photojournalism, or Photo-Travel projected images or monochrome or color prints. There are also specialty areas such as 3D (stereo) projected images and videos. It often requires years of successful participation in international exhibitions to achieve the star rating required to apply for these distinctions.

One more feature of PSA is the annual Conference that is held in a different location each year. Like the annual NECCC Conference in Amherst, the PSA Conference is a wonderful way to make new friends, meet old friends, and share and learn more about photography. The 2015 PSA Conference was held in West Yellowstone, WY this past September.

The 2016 PSA Conference will be going to San Antonio, Texas, Saturday September 10 - Saturday, September 17. The Conference will be based in the Wyndham San Antonio Riverwalk Hotel. In 2017 the Conference will return to Pittsburgh, PA at the Pittsburgh Marriott City Center. Quite a number of us attended the last Conference in Pittsburgh and had a wonderful time exploring the city with our cameras. I'd like to share with you one of my newest favorite places, Valley of Fire State Park. Located 55 miles northeast of Las Vegas, it's an easy hour drive from Las Vegas to get to some of the most unique geological features you could ever expect to find. For whatever reason the park seems to get spectacular light at sunrise and sunset. I would strongly advise against visiting in the summer as the high desert heat would be a severe deterrent to hiking. Although you can get some pretty good shots from the side of the road, many hidden gems require a moderate hike. "Valley of Fire looks and feels like another planet. A true photographer's playground, the Valley of Fire has a little something for everyone. Slot canyons - check! Red rock canyons and hills - check! Swirls of yellow, orange and red layered rock - check! Arches and interesting shaped rocks - check! There's even a rock that looks like an elephant! So, if photographing the beauty of the southwest is up your alley, and you want it all within a short drive to a major metropolitan airport, Valley of Fire is right for you!"


I have visited this park on 3 separate occasions, each time digging deeper to find some incredible features. As a side note, I have just returned from a 7 week photo journey to the desert southwest. It is truly unbelievable how the most popular parks have become so overcrowded, it is almost impossible to do serious photography there. Tour companies are bringing people in by the bus loads; a lot of foreign nationals who think nothing of standing in front of your lens. I do not lie. The same may happen to you at the Fire Wave at sunset, but nowhere near to the extent in other parks.

Valley of Fire is in very close proximity to the North Shore of Lake Mead. The closest town for lodging is Overton, NV. If you plan on staying there over night, I can highly recommend the North Shore Inn:

There is a daily entrance fee of \$10 per vehicle per day and they do not accept any National park passes as it is a State Park. You may camp for \$20/nt.
