

I have four programs that that I've given to various organizations including the Quechee Area Camera Club. They can be presented over Zoom if you have an opening before the world gets back to normal. All of them include some background on the subject and 'how-to' information for photographers. All run roughly one hour – depending on how many questions there are from the audience.

The programs are:

Puffin Stuff – Machias Seal Island off Cutler, Maine, hosts a colony of thousands of puffins and other sea birds every summer. This program looks at how to get there, how to photograph the puffins, et al, and some suggestions for other activities while in Greater Cutler.

An Uncommon Look at the Common Loon – Loons are one of the North Country's iconic symbols. I've spent almost 2,000 hours following and photographing loons from my kayak around New England.

Photographing the Critters in Your Yard – There are lots of great photo ops right in your yard and some easy ways to attract more critters. You don't need outrageously expensive gear or to travel to exotic places to get great wildlife images.

Under Steam – Tracking down our remaining steam locomotives has been a 40+ year project for me. There are roughly 200 working steam locomotives in the US, so far, I've photographed 135 of them at work. This program looks at steam engines large and small from coast to coast.

I'm the former Manager of NASA's Photographic Section (LaRC). I've been an owner in several commercial photo labs back in the days of film. A lot of my photography work has been using photography as an engineering tool as well as having been a news stringer off and on since 1975.
